#### General:



Conference Location:


Conference located at the OSU Tulsa Conference Center at 700 N. Greenwood Ave, Tulsa, OK 74106 See below for directions

Jeanne Alhusen, PhD, CRNP, RN is an Associate Professor and Assistant Dean of Research at the University of Virginia School of Nursing.




Jeanne earned her BSN from Villanova University, MSN/FNP from Duke University, and her PhD from Johns Hopkins School of Nursing. She also completed a postdoctoral fellowship in psychiatric epidemiology, focused on perinatal women, at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. She has practiced as a nurse and family nurse practitioner for more than twenty years, largely focused on caring for women, and children living in poverty. Her research has been funded by NIH, HRSA, and multiple organizations, including March of Dimes and AWHONN.

Rose Horton, MSM, RNC-OB, NEA-BC is the Executive Director of Women & Infants at Emory Decatur Hospital.



Rose obtained both her BSN and MSM from Regis University and served as the 2012 President of the Association Women's Health Obstetrics & Neonatal Nursing (AWHONN) in the Washington D.C. area. With over two decades of experience, Rose has dedicated her career to ensuring that patients are treated with equity and respect. She is passionate about safe and equitable care for ALL women and is committed to decreasing maternal morbidity & mortality. Her use of the hashtag, <u>#notonmywatch</u>, has helped draw attention to a health crisis underscored by a deep racial divide. Horton has been tapped by the Biden administration to participate in the Black Maternal Health Stakeholder Group, which will help guide the administration's work in this area.
